Sounds (Phonemes) - Group 7

Short words ending in the sound or phoneme z are usually spelt with a double letter, just like f, I and s.



Introducing sounds instructions

- 1. {Hold up phoneme card} We are learning the sound _. Say _.
- 2.Can you hear the sound _ in these words? {pick 3 simple words, 2 with the sound and one without}
 - a.Word 1 Yes you can hear _ in [Word 1].
 - b.Word 2 Yes you can hear _ in [Word 2].
 - c.Word 3 No you can't hear _ in [Word 3].
- 3. {Hold up the letter tracing card, with letters outlined} This is the letter symbol we write for the sound _ and we call this _ {say letter name}. Trace this with your finger. Start here. {point to number 1 dot on card}
- 4. This is the sound _. Say _.

High Frequency Words - Group 7

High Frequency words instructions

yes: The letter E {say letter name} uses its short sound /e/ . The letter S {say letter name} at the end of the word is not doubled. Blend /y/ /e/ /s/.

my: y {say the letter name} makes several sounds. At the end of a short word, it often stands for the long /i/ sound {say letter name}, like in by, fly, why, and cry.

by: y {say the letter name} makes several sounds. At the end of a short word, it often stands for the long /i/ sound {say letter name}, like in by, fly, why, and cry.

why: The W-H {say letter names} letter combination says /w/, the H {say letter name} is silent. At the end of a short word, it often stands for the long /i/ sound {say letter name}, like in by, fly, why, and cry. Blend /w/ /i/(long).

Interest words

In Group 7 we introduce **Y**, Y is a consonant some of the time (see the words above). But Y will also be pronounced as a vowel in many words, these concepts are introduced later in a reading program.

Here are the pronunciation rules for Y:

Y at the end of a short one-syllable word is pronounced as long /I/ as in my, by, try, why.

Y at the end of a word with more than one syllable is pronounced as long /E/ as in baby, funny, tiny.

/Y/ in the middle of words is pronounced as a short /i/, as in bicycle, cylinder.

quiz: quiz is not spelt with a double Z as most English words are.
